 - Mr. Zimple gave an overview of the pipeline and also what kind of training is available online.
- Old Business
 - The Joint Emergency Communications Center and EOC are now fully functional.
- Member updates/reports from industry and community partners-all.
 - No new member updates/reports.
- ESF 10 and Cameo updates/status report. (BJ)
 - ESF 10 was converted over from the old Annex P and approved by the State in March, 2010. If you would like a CD copy or web link to ESF 10 please email B.J. Dvorak @ bj.dvorak@jeccema.org and he will send it to you.
 - There are currently 71 tier II facilities registered in Johnson County and they are in the H.E.R.E. system & the Cameo system on the haz mat computers & at EMA.
- Haz Mat Team report or areas of concern-Ken
 - Hazmat Team has responded to 3 calls in 2010.
 - Ken Brown asked all communities to consider raising the haz mat levy from .25 to .35 per person in the next few years. The haz mat levy has not changed since it was created over 15 yrs ago.
- Notes from October 14th SERC meeting in Des Moines (BJ)
 - HMEP grant was voted on and approved by the SERC for FFY 11.
 - 2,300 first responders were trained this year from the grant.
 - 156 people attended the Hazmat Symposium in Ames this year.
 - New Hazmat Team map is out. Teams cover 99.5% of the population in 93 Iowa Counties.
- Haz Mat Ops class grant status- present yr. vs. applied for and commodity flow study. (BJ)
 - During the FFY 2010 HMEP grant period, Johnson County started with \$2,355.49 that was used to conduct Hazmat Operations & refresher classes for first responders. \$1,025.00 of that was spent and the remainder was returned to the State for reallocation. Also, a commodity flow study was completed for Johnson County looking at what substances were being transported on the highways and interstates.

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- During the FFY 2011 grant period, Johnson County will be receiving \$1,098.20 for training and \$2,917.05 to add an analysis of rail and pipeline to the hazardous commodity flow study previously conducted.

 - UIHC has increased their hazmat decontamination capabilities within the last 12 months. Equipment has been purchased to better assist in a mass decontamination event.
